

A \$700,000 EXPANSION at the Friendly Society Private Hospital will ensure more Bundaberg region residents with a cancer diagnosis will have quality treatment available to them, without the need to travel to Brisbane.

The Friendly Society Private Hospital this month officially opened the new unit, which more than doubles in size from the previous service.

Friendly Society Private Hospital CEO Alan Cooper said the oncology expansion had been a high priority since the space became available in February.

"Cancer diagnosis and treatment is one of the most difficult situations our patients have to face and we are committed to ensuring the space where they receive

their treatment is as comfortable as it can be and that we do everything we can to provide them the best quality treatment and services possible."

The Friendlies opened the former Day Oncology Unit in 2011, after a growing need for a dedicated oncology treatment space. The hospital then welcomed its current permanent oncologist Dr Vikram Jain in April 2012.

"The expanded oncology unit will not only be more comfortable for patients, but also for their visitors and loved ones as well. We will have an expanded waiting room, larger treatment areas and a dedicated space for video conferencing and specialist consultation." Mr Cooper said.

Mr Cooper said The Friendlies continued

to focus on providing excellent care to all people in the Wide Bay and Burnett region.

"Patients at The Friendlies have no out-of-pocket expenses for chemotherapy and related drugs and they have access to cancer council nurses and volunteers.

"They also have access to our allied health team of physiotherapists, occupational therapists and a dietitian, as well as seven-day access to our dedicated oncologist Dr Jain.

"We also have a 'total care' approach to our patients, with a multi-disciplinary team of surgeons, general physicians, radiation oncologist, radiographer, urologist, gynecologist, cardiologist and nurse manager who meet and review all cases weekly."

Community Support essential to expansion

SUPPORT FROM THE COMMUNITY has been essential in expanding the oncology service at The Friendlies.

The Friendlies Foundation made its first donation to the Day Oncology Unit, in an amount of \$20,000.

"It is wonderful that The Friendlies Foundation, through the support of the community, is able to help the hospital fund the refurbishment of this unit," public relations officer Fiona Macaulay said.

"We were also grateful to receive a donation of \$1100, which was used to purchase tray arms for the new oncology chairs."

Chairman and family raise \$700,000 for outback mental health support

FINDING OUT THE suicide rate for men in the outback is up to three-times higher than their coast counterparts prompted Friendly Society Private Hospital board chairman Les Hancock to establish an event that has raised \$700,000 in just five events.

Mr Hancock, along with wife Shelley and son Damian founded RideWest in 2010, a charity cycling event to raise money for the Royal Flying Doctor Service, for its primary health care role in the area of mental health in the outback.

"The event has been a great success," Mr Hancock said.

"We have had five charity cycle rides, four from Brisbane to Longreach and one ride from Longreach to Tenant Creek, and we have raised and donated in excess of \$700,000 to the Royal Flying Doctor Service."

Mrs Hancock has been the event manager for all five rides, while Les and

Damian rode in all rides – a total of more than 6000km

"In our most recent ride in May this year, we had 22 riders who raised in excess of \$210,000 for the 7-day event," Mr Hancock said.

The Hancock family have stepped away from the RideWest event management, although Les remains as the event chairman.

Mr Hancock is now keen to use his experience to bring a similar charity cycling event closer to home.

"I have been a board member at The Friendlies for 15 years and the chair for the past 12 months and one of the most exciting things we have been able to do is launch The Friendlies Foundation," he said.

"We are going to use our RideWest experience to establish a 3-day, fully supported ride for about 60 cyclists over the May day long weekend in 2017.

"The ride will begin and end in Bundaberg,

but take in the beautiful region west of here to areas like Biggenden, Gayndah and Mt Perry."

Mr Hancock said the aim of the charity ride would be to raise \$100,000 for The Friendlies Foundation, to go towards expanding the cardiology services offered at The Friendlies.

The event has already attracted three major sponsors in Auswide Bank, Ulton and RBS Morgans.
